

CAMP REGULATIONS

2018 Christian Camp for the Deaf

1. Every person should act like a Christian.
2. Every camper must follow the camp schedule, unless the Director gives special permission.
3. Every person must stay on the camp grounds, unless the Director gives special permission.
4. **NO** alcoholic beverages, beer, tobacco, smoking, all illegal drugs (except those prescribed for health), and bad languages are allowed in camp.
5. Campers may not drive or ride in cars, motorcycles, boats, all-terrain vehicles, boats, and so forth during the camp, unless the Director gives special permission.
6. If anyone is sick or hurt, hurry to tell the Camp Doctor/Registered Nurse. All medicines must be given to the Doctor/Registered Nurse or the appointed person on the first day of camp. The Nurse will give the medicine as prescribed during the week. On the last day of the camp you must get the rest of your medicines back from the Nurse.
7. Any activities or programs not printed on schedule that need to be added or changed, must be approved by the Director.
8. **NO** radios. TV sets, tape recorders and players, magazines and books (except Bibles and Christian magazines and books), comic books, or pets are allowed at the camp.
9. Dress code:
 - a. Every person must always wear shoes except when sleeping, swimming or bathing.
 - b. Bermuda shorts are OK, but they must be within of your own palm from your knees. **NO** halter or spaghetti strap tops. Also, **NO** tank tops.
 - c. For swimming, girls must wear one-piece swimsuits. Two-piece swimsuits are **NOT** permitted at the camp. Boys must wear the Bermuda style (**NO** short trunks).
 - d. Do **NOT** bring clothes that advertise beer, sex, or have any wordings that could give bad ideas. Do **NOT** bring any clothes that Christian should **not** wear.
10. Boys and girls should **NOT** kiss or show love for each other in ways that are **NOT** good for others to see.
11. Any person who does **NOT** obey these rules may be sent home at his/her expenses.
12. Girls may wear earrings, but **NOT** boys. They could **NOT** be permitted with any other piercing at camp.
13. Camp riot are **NOT** allowed. Any campers caught maliciously damaging camp property will be sent home and held responsible for the repairs or costs incurred from his/her actions. This includes writing on cabin walls, floors, sidewalks and such like, intentionally breaking things, etc.
14. Campers will **NOT** be on the fishing piers and canoeing unsupervised. When on schedule periods for canoeing, paddleboards, water slides, banana boats, swimming, and any other water games, every campers must wear life jackets at all the time.
15. Campers will **NOT** have knives, any kind of weapons, fireworks, or other dangerous articles in their possessions while in residence at camp.
16. Under some circumstances, campers are **NOT** permitted to use the pagers and cell phones during the activities, devotionals, and at bedtime. If anyone do **NOT** abide by the regulations and their devices may be taken out of them until they are returning back home.
